

My congratulations to the record number who made All American this year. I am confident that we will repeat or exceed those numbers in the coming year. Virginia's hospitality room was also a big hit among the attendees. My thanks to Mark and Jennifer Winn and all of those who helped them manage the room and for also helping manage Hal Roesch's hospitality suite.

The Winter Council of Administration meeting scheduled for January 2020 has been moved from Blacksburg to Portsmouth. We were really looking forward to being in Blacksburg, but due to events beyond our control, we cannot have our meeting at the Blacksburg facility. The reason is that the University overbooked their incoming class and will be using the top three floors of the hotel for student housing. We were offered only the ground floor, which is insufficient to accommodate our members. Also, it would not be a good idea to operate hospitality suites at a facility shared by young college students. So, we'll be back in Portsmouth in January. The Department did not suffer any financial loss due to the move.

We are hitting the ground running with Schools of Instruction at District meetings. Additionally, we will hold two other training sessions; one for recruiting and one for quartermasters and trustees. We'll have concurrent sessions to be held on the eastern and western side of the state. Recruiter training is set for September 14 at Posts 9808 (Mechanicsville) and 1264 (Roanoke) starting at 9:00 AM. Quartermaster/trustee training is on October 5 at Posts 2239 (Colonial Heights) and 1264 (Roanoke) also starting at 9:00 AM.

State Judge Advocate Eddie Reasor is busy planning a membership roundup in the 12th District for November 8-10. We plan to visit every Post in the District and get to know as many members as we can. We are also looking at another roundup in the 1st and 2nd District areas sometime in the early Spring.

This is a simple go-by for submissions to The Virginia Veteran. Submissions DO NOT have to be in the format below...if it comes down to a format or just plain getting a submission, I'll take the submission! Please note that I do not typically edit them down. Most of what I do is work placement of submitted articles and photos to provide a layout flow and consistency. Please keep sending articles, or even photos with a caption, for inclusion...we appreciate each and every one of them. It is truly great to see all that our posts are doing for Veterans all over the state and even beyond! Here are some brief guidelines and information.

<u>Publishing/Font Information</u>:

- The paper is produced in Microsoft Publisher; however, MS Word converts easily.
- The Font is Times New Roman (11 pitch for article body and 9 pitch for photo captions).
- Line spacing in paragraphs is 1.19 between lines and 6pt after paragraphs.

Scanned/photographed articles:

- Clear, squared shots for readable text enable optical character recognition & save retyping. This is particularly important if the article is longer. Transcribing an article simply takes too long.
- If reprint permission is needed, please cite that. If already obtained, please list the point of contact.
- If you know of an online link to a cited article, please provide.

Photographs:

- If you would like personnel cited, please provide names and positions in the photo.
- If you would like credit to the photographer, please cite them.

Article Length:

- Generally, articles should not be more than two pages including photos. If you provide the text and photos, I will sort them throughout the article where they go, if at all possible. Submission deadlines are 1 week prior to the follow publication dates:



With the commitment of the state leadership to continue the success and a goal of making 2019-2020 the fifth consecutive year of achieving this award, the offer to help everyone could not be clearer.

I honor the American flag because it helped me find my true potential. You don't have to be born in the U.S. to love the flag. You don't have to look American or have an American background; You have to treat others equally and be treated equally. It matters that you stay truthful to yourself through any battle in your life. At Fort McHenry, the flag stood through the War of 1812, clinging to the little piece of hope that lingered on through all the bloodshed and tears. I, too, have stood true to myself through conflict and tears. On Feb. 5, 2008, I was adopted from a country many American soldiers gave their lives to protect. I officially became a U.S. citizen, but I didn't always feel like one. When I first started school, I felt uncomfortable saying the Pledge of Allegiance, staring up at the flag, because kids always asked me questions about my parents, my adoption, and where I was from. It was as though they thought I was an alien. . As I got older, I started caring less and less about what other kids thought. I kept saying to myself, "Let them look, let them think what they want, but this .country is where I know who I am." After that realization, I carried on through each day no matter what words or questions were thrown at me. The flag made me feel included, not unworthy. Now, I take pride in my American ancestry. My great-great-great grandfather fought at the Battles of Concord and Bunker Hill. The Stars and Stripes were there with him, the 13 stripes symbolizing the original colonies, including my family's own ancestral state of Massachusetts. The red on the flag symbolizes valor, the courage of those who fought there, and my own courage in asserting myself here, too. The white stripes on the flag symbolize the purity of the motives for which my ancestors fought, and it also symbolizes the original goodness of every American citizen. The blue ort the flag symbolizes the justice of their cause and their perseverance in fighting fur it, and it also symbolizes my own perseverance to serve my country in the best possible way I can.

National WWI Commission Podcasts Virginia VFW Author

The World War One Centennial Commission featured Virginia VFW member and military historian Greg Eanes on its June 2019 (episode #127) podcast. Eanes is a member of VFW Post 7819 in Crewe, serves as Chief of Staff for the 4th District VFW and is a visiting lecturer in U.S. National Intelligence at Hampden-Sydney College.

Eanes wrote <u>Captured</u>, <u>Not Conquered</u>: <u>The American POW Experience in the First World War</u> and commented on that topic. During the seven-minute segment he pointed out American POWs in 1917 had to 'write the book' on POW leadership and resistance techniques. He noted that much of what they implemented out of necessity was later replicated in World War II, eventually became military doctrine and is now taught in appropriate U.S. military schoolhouses.

The Centennial Commission was created by Act of Congress in 2013 to support education, historic preservation and public events memorializing U.S. participation in the First World War. Its board includes Debra Anderson, Quartermaster General of the National VFW Headquarters in Kansas City. The podcast features stories on World War I and its lasting legacies as it pertains to the United States.

Powerhouse Gaming Becomes an Exclusive Partner, Commits \$225,000 to the Foundation

During the State Convention, a new partnership was announced between Virginia VFW and Powerhouse gaming. The partnership makes Powerhouse the exclusive electronic gaming partner for the Department and provides numerous opportunities. The largest and immediate show of support was a commitment for \$13,000 as a convention sponsor and a three year sponsorship which will result in \$225,000 being donated to our Foundation for programs and projects.

Powerhouse Gaming is a manufacturer of electronic pull tab games that operate legally under Virginia gaming rules. While the company is not a stranger to Virginia, this partnership was a major step forward in how Powerhouse shows its support to the VFW and our Auxiliary. The three year sponsorship will fund programs in the VFW, our Auxiliary, and the Virginia Veterans Foundation (our official foundation). Annually, this includes \$15,000 for the Auxiliary, \$8,000 for our Service Officer program, \$6,000 for grants to Posts and Auxiliaries for their Post homes and community service, and much more.

"Powerhouse has stepped up in a huge way and proven it lives up to its motto 'Where the Charity Comes First' which strengthens the work we do" said State Commander Rick Raskin.

The partnership has other options including help that Powerhouse will give to Posts who seek a permanent home and help to start new Posts. Those with homes can look at charitable gaming as a strong, proven source of gaming. Additionally, Powerhouse partners with other companies who provide paper pull tabs, paper materials for bingo, items needed for canteens, and other support.

"Having a home changes everything for a Post and makes their future even brighter" said State Commander Raskin. Rick added "Seeing this as part of what Powerhouse offered to help with convinced a lot of people this was the right partner for us".

Once the State Council of Administration approved the partnership on the Thursday of State Convention, Past State Commander Ken Wiseman and Past State President Patty Baskett accepted the ceremonial checks on behalf of the organization.


Virginia Riders Donate Largest Check Ever to Vander Clute Ride for VFW Programs





In the end, the structure and the contents were deemed a "total loss".

While Post members are deeply saddened by this tragic event, a renewed sense of purpose has stirred our aged and experienced membership. Along with the Front Royal community, these Veterans, many having served in our Nations conflicts from WWII to the present day, are committed to restoring the Post and its stature as a charitable giving resource.

Our small Post has much fight left in it and with your help, we can rebuild a modest structure and reclaim our place serving the Front Royal and surrounding communities



The highlight of the tour was the ability to take a picture of the one bat that had not left the cave yet.

After the Caverns it was on to Lord Botetourt VFW Post 1841 for dinner. President Kriebel was escorted to the Aisle of Honor by Conductor Fred Jennings. The Aisle was composed of Auxiliary members, Department officers and finally District officers. After being pinned with a patriotic corsage, she individually greeted and talked with the members on her way to the head table.



Past National President Dee Guillory was the Mistress of Ceremonies. The dinner started with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a prayer. 



Procedure, and policy resolutions were passed with Virgin-






