1. COMMANDER'S MESSAGE:

April is a month of holidays. This year, the major holidays of Ramadan, Easter and Passover will all be occurring in April. For me it signifies warmer weather and a "Spring Surge" in recruiting. We had a busy VFW month in March and the following is a brief recap of events:

In the last five weeks we have opened two new VFW Posts in Virginia! On February 25th we held the Post 12217 Holland Institution; on March 11th we followed that, with the Post 12218 Western Prince William County Post Institution. Both of these Posts are in enthusiastic, vibrant communities and well placed for growth. We are expecting great things from these Posts in the future. When you see these members at an event, please give them a hearty welcome to our VFW family.

We had a great time at the northern Virginia Centennial Celebration at VFW Post 1503 Dale City! We were honored to have as our guests, the Commander-In-Chief; the National SVC, JVC, QM and Adjutant and their staff. They were escorted to the venue by our VFW Riders. The event was smash hit with good food and drink, free gifts and emblematic sales. Thank you, to all who attended. Special thanks to VFW Post 1503 Dale City for hosting. Our next Centennial Celebration will be April 22nd at Post 2447, Edinburg; all members and their families are welcome.

On March 6th the 76th National "Parade of Winners" was held in Crystal City, VA. The VFW proudly presented more than \$171,000 in scholarships and awards as it named the national winners of its 2023 Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen youth scholarship competitions. We are very proud of our Virginia state winners: VOD first place

winner John P. McGraw sponsored by Post 7589 Manassas in District 8 and Patriots Pen first place winner Nathan D. Wallin sponsored by Post 3219 Phoebus in District 1.

National Legislative Conference attendees stayed in Crystal City this month, as they prepped for our Commander-In-Chief's testimony. On March 8th, the Department of Virginia delegation was there, in a standing-room-only packed chamber in the Cannon House Office Building, as Chief Tim Borland delivered his message of "Every Veteran Counts" during in-person testimony before the 118th Congress during a special joint hearing of the House and Senate Committees on Veterans' Affairs held Wednesday. Backed by almost 400 VFW and VFW Auxiliary members CIC Borland spoke on the PACT Act of 2022 expanded benefits; cracking down on "predatory claims consultants" in filing VA claims (via GUARD VA Benefits Act); veteran suicide prevention; improved and expanded Transition Assistance Program (TAP) for separating veterans; and ending the practice of offsetting DOD retirement and VA disability pay. Thanks to our Virginia legislative team who lobbied legislators during the Legislative Conference. Their efforts made a difference for veterans.

On March 3rd a Virginia Life Member received the Congressional Medal of Honor (CMOH). COL Paris Davis, a Vietnam veteran and Life Member of Post VFW Post 7916 in Woodbridge, VA, received the CMOH at the White House after nearly 60 years. He was honored at a White House ceremony as the President hung the blue ribbon around his neck." The VFW is very proud of him, and I reached out to pass him our congratulations.

This past month your VFW marched in several parades performing Color Guard duties: including the George Washington Parade (Alexandria); the *Ballyshaners* St. Patrick's Parade (Alexandria) and the Ocean View St. Patrick's Day Parade (Norfolk).

We are nearing the end of our administrative and membership year. If you haven't already done so, please get your Community Reports submitted; we intend to be 100 percent by the end of this month. Continue to review the All-State requirements and Dashboard status for your Post and District. We want as many Posts as possible to qualify for All State this year.

Our membership is strong at over 98 percent, needing approximately 500 members to make 100 percent. Thanks to our outstanding Membership Team. I encourage all of our leaders to start setting up your events for the Spring Recruiting Surge. Spring has historically been one of the strongest times of the year for recruiting and retention. Let's sprint to the finish line and put the Department of Virginia over the top this spring! Have a great month.

2. ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP:

The National Bylaws provide for only one type of membership: active membership. There are no provisions in the National Bylaws, nor is there any authority or justification for issuance of Club Membership cards, Associate Member cards, Honorary Membership cards, Courtesy Membership cards or any other special type of cards. Any Post issuing such unauthorized cards, or conducting club operations open to the general public, endangers its standing with the Internal Revenue Service as a non-profit organization. Officers signing outlaw cards admitting non-members to VFW premises are subject to disciplinary action. National and Department officers cannot defend practices that conflict with VFW Bylaws or procedures.

3. AUDITS:

Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Section 218 (a)(11) of the National Manual of Procedure, Officers: Duties and Obligations. Trustees Report of Audit must be prepared in detail within thirty (30) days from the end of each quarter, one of which ended March 31.

4. AWARDS:

State Awards and All State information were in last month's General Orders, along with the various entry forms.

5. CALENDAR RAFFLE:

This year the calendar raffle becomes my responsibility. I wanted to do something a little different this year. This year I want to thank and welcome home all our Vietnam Veterans. This makes the calendar a little more personal to many comrades and Auxiliary Members to buy one for themselves or as a gift to a Vietnam veteran. 8. DELEGATES TO DISTRICT/DEPARTMENT CONVENTION:

Section 222 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure provides that delegates and alternates for the District Convention and meetings, Department and National Conventions shall be elected at a regular meeting in April. Posts are entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each thirty (30) members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Post as of March 31.

Pursuant to Section 403 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure, each District shall hold an annual District Convention for the purpose of electing District officers, such convention to be held not less than ten (10) days nor more than seventy-five (75) days prior to the convening of the Department Convention.

Pursuant to Section 403 of the National Bylaws – Regular Meeting, Districts shall hold at least two (2) regular meetings each year for purposes of transacting business and conducting schools of instruction.

Pursuant to Section 417 of the National Manual of Procedure, District officers shall not assume the duties of their office until the Department Commander is installed.

District officers shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and properly reviewed in accordance with Section 416 of the Manual of Procedure.

9. E-MAIL ACCOUNT ACCESS:

All email accounts were reset so the new Officers could take control of their emails as of **June 15th**. This will be the primary means of sending correspondence from State Headquarters to Post and District Officers.

You will receive all General Orders, special notices and any other documentation that you need via email. This will help cut down on postal expenses and speed up the response time for you receiving the information.

Here are directions for logging into your new account for the first time.

- 1.Go to Department web site <u>www.vfwva.org</u>.
- 2. Click on Resources, Microsoft 365.
- 3. The username is your email address; put that on the first line (see below for your new address).
- 4. Your default password will be **VFW2022!** once you have accessed the mail program you will be asked to change it; it must contain at least one uppercase letter and one number.

12. INSTALLING OFFICERS:

Installing officers will see that the provisions of Section 216 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure are properly carried out and that all officers are members in good standing and qualified to hold office prior to installing Post officers for the current year. Post officers shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and properly reviewed.

Post-Election Reports must be submitted following Post election of officers in April and no later than June 1 to the National Headquarters. We highly encourage all Post Quartermasters to use the online Election Report process featured in the Online Membership System (OMS). Post-Election Reports received electronically will be forwarded to the Department Headquarters.

13. IRS FORM 8822-B:

IRS Form 8822-B, it is now a requirement by the IRS that all Posts submit this form. This form must be submitted anytime the Post Quartermaster changes and/or the Post address changes. This is effective January 1, 2014.

14. NATIONAL CONVENTION HOUSING REGISTRATION:

124th National Convention housing officially opened February 17, 2023. Housing reservation information will be located on the convention website accessed through the main VFW website at vfw.org/convention. The convention

website will also have general convention information including the registration form and links to other convention related information for Phoenix, Arizona – July 22-27, 2023, including a tentative agenda.

Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Section 222 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure, which provides that each Post will pay, in advance, a National Convention registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) which shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the National Convention. Each additional delegate attending the National Convention will pay a ten dollar (\$10) delegate fee. Posts are encouraged to register their Post delegate(s) online through the Online Membership System (OMS) or by submitting their National Convention Registration form that will be mailed to all Posts as part of the Election Report/Convention Registration mailing going out later this month. Registration forms for the 124th National Convention may be mailed to: Convention Registration, 406 W. 34th Street, Kansas City, MO 64111.

18. POSTS IN ARREARS FOR FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS:

Attention is directed to Section 213 of the National Bylaws concerning any Post in arrears for any financial obligations to County Council (if applicable), District, Department and National for fees, dues, poppy money, supply money, failing to have the office of Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703, failing to ensure that the Post is properly insured in accordance with Section 709, failing to submit properly completed quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit, Post-Election Report for the ensuing year, or other obligations, shall be deprived of all representation in County Council and District meetings; County Council, District, Department and National Conventions. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustment of such deficiencies.

WILLIAMSON be removed from the rolls of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States for a period of six (6) months commencing March 16, 2023, and ending on September 16, 2023, and issued a letter of reprimand by the Department Commander. On completion of the suspension period, his membership will be transferred to Department of Virginia Member-at-Large after which time he will be eligible to transfer to a Post of his choosing in accordance with Section 107 of the National Bylaws.

30. VFW SPECIAL PROJECT PROGRAM:

This program was put in place to recognize VFW units for creating and completing unique and extraordinary community service projects.

Record book entry nominations that are found to be complete and well-substantiated should be endorsed by the Department Adjutant or VFW Department Community Activities Chairperson and forwarded to National Programs Department. Deadline for entries is April 30 of each year.

Every Post Special Project receiving the Award of Excellence in the May judging will be entered in the Fred C. Hall Memorial Outstanding Post Special Project Competition. Complete information can be found in the VFW Community Activities and Citizenship Education Chairperson's Guide.

31. VIETNAM WAR COMMEMORATION:

This month I provided Vietnam Veteran commemoration pins to Posts 12218 (4), 8446 (7) and 622 (11). I requested and received a new supply of pins from the National Commemoration Commission in Arlington so have more available to send to Posts that have a need.

This month's Vietnam War Congressional Medal of Honor winner is Colonel Paris D. Davis, USA.

Colonel Davis earned his commission through ROTC in 1959. He subsequently earned his Ranger Tab and his Special Forces insignia. He served overseas in Korea, Okinawa and Vietnam in the early 60's. Davis arrived for his second tour in South Vietnam in April 1965 and took command of <u>5th Special Forces Group</u> A-team A-321 at Camp Bong Son. On 18 June 1965, Davis and three of his Special Forces team led the <u>Army of the Republic of Vietnam</u> (ARVN) 883rd <u>Regional Forces</u> Company in an attack on a <u>Viet Cong</u> (VC) base. Davis' CMH paperwork was twice submitted (1965 & 1969) but never acted upon. He received the Silver Star and Purple Heart as a result.

In 2021, a review of records uncovered the nomination which was ultimately approved in November 2022. He was finally presented the Medal of Honor by President Biden at a White House Ceremony on March 3rd, 2023.

The President of the United States of America, authorized by Act of Congress, March 3rd, 1863, has awarded in the name of Congress the Medal of Honor to Captain Paris D. Davis, United States Army, for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his own life above and beyond the call of duty. Captain Paris D. Davis distinguished himself by acts of gallantry and intrepidity above and beyond the call of duty while serving as Commander of Detachment A-321, 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne), 1st Special Forces, during combat operations against an armed enemy in the vicinity of Bong Son, Republic of Vietnam, June 17-18, 1965. Captain Davis, commanding an inexperienced South Vietnamese regional raiding force, learned that a vastly superior North Vietnamese enemy force was operating in the area. Through surprise and leadership, he gained the tactical advantage, personally engaging and killing several enemy soldiers. Wounded while leading the initial assault, Captain Davis continued moving forward, personally engaging the enemy in hand-to-hand combat. Launching a counterattack, the superior enemy force separated Captain Davis from his main Regional Force Company. Charging under the intense enemy fire, Captain Davis personally led four others in the destruction of enemy gun emplacements and captured more enemy personnel. Afterwards, Captain Davis moved to regroup his forces and break contact with the enemy to allow his expertly guided tactical air and artillery fire to obliterate the foe. However, the enemy again counterattacked in superior numbers and Captain Davis was struck by automatic weapons fire. So close was the charging enemy soldier that shot him, Captain Davis engaged him in close-quarter combat and was again wounded in the process of defeating this soldier. Captain Davis then led his men to reorganize into abandoned enemy fighting positions as he continued to call for artillery and air support. Realizing two of his fellow Americans were incapacitated and unable to move while trapped by enemy fire, Captain Davis located their positions and moved to suppress enemy guns and personally rescue each to the safety of the friendly Company position. While enacting the rescue of the first American, Captain Davis was shot in the leg. In great pain he continued forward and dragged him to the Company perimeter. Captain Davis then exposed himself again to the intense enemy fire to rescue the second American, crawling 150 yards to complete the rescue while being hit by enemy grenade fragments. After rescuing the second fellow American, Captain Davis then personally directed the helicopter extraction for the wounded, but refused medical extraction for himself. Captain Davis continued to engage the enemy until all members of his Company were extracted. He remained on the battlefield to continue personal coordination of tactical air and artillery fire, ensuring the destruction of the enemy force.

Davis served a third tour in Vietnam in 1969, and later commanded the <u>10th Special Forces Group</u> and retired from the army as a colonel in 1985. Davis published the <u>Metro Herald</u> newspaper in <u>Virginia</u> for 30 years. He is now retired and lives in <u>Arlington County</u>, <u>Virginia</u>.
