2. ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP:

The National Bylaws provide for only one type of membership: active membership. There are no provisions in the National Bylaws, nor is there any authority or justification for issuance of Club Membership cards, Associate Member cards, Honorary Membership cards, Courtesy Membership cards or any other special type of cards. Any Post issuing such unauthorized cards, or conducting club operations open to the general public, endangers its standing with the Internal Revenue Service as a non-profit organization. Officers signing outlaw cards admitting non-members to VFW premises are subject to disciplinary action. National and Department officers cannot defend practices that conflict with VFW Bylaws or procedures.

3. BONDS:

ALL BONDS EXPIRED AUGUST 31, 2025.

Please see July or August General Orders for the rate schedule for the cost of your bond and return completed forms and payment to State Headquarters. Please note Quartermaster Bond rate **is for** the Post Officers. There is a separate schedule for your canteen employees and others who are not Post Officers but need to be bonded. Remember that persons on any/or all accounts the Post has **MUST BE BONDED**.

EACH PERSON BONDED MUST BE ON A SEPARATE FORM. EXAMPLE DO NOT PUT QM AND COMMANDER ON SAME FORM, THERE MUST BE TWO FORMS COMPLETED BEFORE BONDS CAN BE PROCESSED. IF YOU ARE NOT SURE WHICH FORM YOU SHOULD BE USING CONTACT STATE HEADQUARTERS.

20. SPECIAL ORDERS NO. 132:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 212 of the National Bylaws and upon the recommendation of the Commander, Department of Virginia, due to their failure to elect the required officers while under suspension, the Charter of Accomack Post No. 2296, Tasley, Virginia, mustered December 10, 1995, is hereby cancelled and the

Post declared defunct. Such cancellation includes a revocation of the right to use all trademarks and service marks, including the name, emblems/insignia, seals and logos, of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

The Commander, Department of Virginia, will at once recover the charter, rituals, paraphernalia and all monies and other property of the Post in accordance with the provisions of the National Bylaws.

21. VIRGINIA VIETNAM WAR COMMEMORATION:

As part of a continuing effort to recognize those who earned the Medal of Honor during the Vietnam War, I submit the following:

John R. Kerry was born in Lincoln, NE in August 1943. He earned his BS in Pharmacy from the University of Nebraska in 1966. He completed Officer Candidate School in Newport in 1967 and went on to BUD/S (SEAL) training with Class 42 in December 1967. He deployed to Vietnam as an assistant platoon commander in SEAL Team One in January 1969. Kerrey was seriously wounded and lost the lower part of his right leg in combat on Hon Tre island near [Nha Trang](#) Bay on March 14, 1969. While suffering shrapnel wounds and blood loss, Kerrey organized his squad in a counterattack that killed or captured enemy Viet Cong. He was later medically discharged from the US Navy due to his wounds. On May 14, 1970, President Richard Nixon awarded Kerrey the Medal of Honor for his heroic actions. His citation reads as follows:

.....

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty on 14 March 1969 while serving as a SEAL Team Leader during action against enemy aggressor (Viet Cong) forces in the Republic of Vietnam. Acting in response to reliable intelligence, Lieutenant (jg) Kerrey led his SEAL Team on a mission to capture important members of the enemy's area political cadre known to be located on an island in the bay of Nha Trang. In order to surprise the enemy, he and his team scaled a 350-foot sheer cliff to place themselves above the ledge on which the enemy was located. Splitting his team in two elements and coordinating both, Lieutenant (jg) Kerrey led his men in the treacherous downward descent to the enemy's camp. Just as they neared the end of their descent, intense enemy fire was directed at them, and Lieutenant (jg) Kerrey received massive injuries from a grenade which exploded at his feet and threw him backward onto the jagged rocks. Although bleeding profusely and suffering great pain, he displayed outstanding courage and presence of mind in immediately directing his element's fire into the heart of the enemy camp. Utilizing his radioman, Lieutenant (jg) Kerrey called in the second element's fire support which caught the confused Viet Cong in a devastating cross fire. After successfully suppressing the enemy's fire, and although immobilized by his multiple wounds, he continued to maintain calm, superlative control as he ordered his team to secure and defend an extraction site. Lieutenant (jg) Kerrey resolutely directed his men, despite his near-unconscious state, until he was eventually evacuated by helicopter. The havoc brought to the enemy by this very successful mission cannot be overestimated. The enemy who were captured provided critical intelligence to the allied effort. Lieutenant (jg) Kerrey's courageous and inspiring leadership, valiant fighting spirit, and tenacious devotion to duty in the face of almost overwhelming opposition, sustain and enhance the finest traditions of the United States Naval Service.

In addition to the Medal of Honor, John Kerry earned the Bronze Star Medal, Purple Heart and Combat Action Ribbon in addition to various service and campaign medals. Following his Naval service, Kerry pursued a business career from 1972-1982. He ran for Governor of Nebraska and won, choosing to serve one term. In 1988, he was

elected to the United States Senate and served until January 2001. He was an unsuccessful candidate for the Democratic nomination for Vice President in 1992, served on the 9-11 Commission and became a university president, retiring in 2010. John Kerry still resides in Nebraska.

PURPOSE OF THE VFW AUXILIARY

Since 1914, the VFW Auxiliary has been fulfilling its original objectives by supporting the Veterans of Foreign Wars, serving veterans and active-duty military and their families, and spreading patriotism nationwide.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO JOIN THE VFW AUXILIARY?

Male and female relatives (listed below) of persons who served in a war, campaign, or expedition on foreign soil or in hostile waters.

- Members must be at least 16 years old.
- Husband/wife; widower/widow; father/mother; brothers/sisters; sons/daughters; grandfathers/grandmothers; grandsons & granddaughters.

HOW THE AUXILIARY ASSISTS THE VFW POST.

A few examples:

1. Helps raise funds for charitable projects that benefit veterans, military service personnel, and their families.
2. Assists the VFW to pass or block legislation that impacts veterans benefits and their families.
3. Prepares care packages for the military stationed overseas.
4. Works to instill patriotism in our youth and provides youth scholarships.
5. Volunteers in the VA Medical Centers and other medical facilities.
6. Raises awareness for military and veteran suicide.
7. Assists the Post, if requested, with their Buddy Poppy Drives.
8. Assists with preparing and delivering meals for aging veterans.
9. Assists the VFW with their holiday celebrations and veteran's events.

VFW STEPS TO START AN AUXILIARY

1. A VFW Post must by 2/3 majority vote of the membership present at a regular meeting (or a special meeting) to have an Auxiliary.
2. Consult the **VFW Bylaws** regarding required notice to the Post membership when voting to form an Auxiliary to the Post.
3. The approval to form a Post Auxiliary is to be recorded in the VFW meeting minutes.
4. If the Post votes to approve an Auxiliary, then the Post notifies the Department President who will appoint an official organizer, and the organizer must be a **VFW Auxiliary** member.



Our *Register* is a one-of-a-kind interactive database that records and preserves the names, service information, photographs and memorable experiences of each registered servicewoman.

Register records and preserves the history of the powerful women who have defended this country—both past and present.

From the earliest days of the nation, women have been serving alongside men to gain and preserve liberty, but it was difficult to find them in our history books. There was no repository of women's service to the United States. That all changed in April 1987.

Not long after legislation authorized the Women In Military Service For America Memorial and ten years before the Memorial would open to the public in 1997, the *Register* was created. Servicewomen and women veterans were invited to make their military experiences visible by "registering" their service. By completing a simple form with their dates of service, branch of service, awards and decorations, at least one memorable experience, and a picture in uniform, women took their rightful and visible place in history for all time. For the first time in American history, there was a place to learn about the extraordinary servicewomen who defend or have defended our country.

For more than 30 years, the Memorial has been permanently documenting military women's experiences and their impact on American, military and women's history. Visitors are invited to look up

servicewomen in the *Register*, learn about their impact on our collective history, and purchase a print of individual profiles as a keepsake.

If you know a servicewoman or woman veteran, please take advantage of the FREE registration to ensure HERstory joins hundreds of thousands of individual stories that make up our *Register*.

History is not complete until every military woman's story is told.

VFW Music Licensing Exemption Checklist (Virginia)

Based on Federal Copyright Law – 17 U.S.C. § 110(10)

This checklist helps determine whether a Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post event qualifies as a non-public performance and is therefore exempt from paying ASCAP, BMI, or SESAC public performance licenses.

1. Organization Status

- ☐ The event is organized by a nonprofit veterans' organization (chartered VFW Post).
- ☐ The Post is in good standing as a 501(c)(19) or operates under the national VFW's nonprofit umbrella.
- ☒ Why it matters: The exemption specifically applies to nonprofit veterans', fraternal, and membership organizations.

2. Type of Music

- ☐ The performance involves nondramatic musical works (recorded, live band, DJ, or karaoke).
- ☐ No theatrical or dramatic performances are included.
- ☒ Examples allowed: jukebox, live band, DJ, karaoke, background music.
- ☒ Not covered: musicals, operas, or dramatic performances.

3. Audience Restrictions

- ☐ Attendance limited to members and immediate guests.
- ☐ Not advertised to or open to the general public.
- ☐ Access controlled (membership card or guest list).
- ☒ Members-only events qualify; public dances or rentals do not.

4. Admission and Proceeds

- ☐ No admission charge or fees only cover reasonable costs (food, DJ, decorations).
- ☐ All proceeds used solely for charitable or Post purposes (no private profit).
- ☒ 'At cost' events are fine; proceeds can support veterans' programs.

5. Sponsorship & Control

- ☐ The Post organizes and manages the event (not an outside promoter).
- ☐ If a DJ or band is hired, they are under Post supervision.
- ☐ The music is incidental to a social function, not business activity.

6. Location & Use

- ☐ Event held in Post-controlled facility (canteen, hall, or grounds).
- ☐ Facility not rented to outside groups for public use.
- ☐ Music played on-premises only (not broadcast or streamed).

7. Optional Best Practices

- ☐ Keep documentation of nonprofit status (IRS letter or VFW charter).
- ☐ Record event details in Post minutes (date, audience type, purpose).
- ☐ If any public events occur during the year, consider a low-cost blanket license (~\$300-\$600/yr).

If all boxes are checked → No license is required under 17 U.S.C. § 110(10).

If any are unchecked → The Post likely needs a license (ASCAP, BMI, SESAC nonprofit rate).
