2. ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP:

The National Bylaws provide for only one type of membership: active membership. There are no provisions in the National Bylaws, nor is there any authority or justification for issuance of Club Membership cards, Associate Member cards, Honorary Membership cards, Courtesy Membership cards or any other special type of cards. Any Post issuing such unauthorized cards, or conducting club operations open to the general public, endangers its standing with the Internal Revenue Service as a non-profit organization. Officers signing outlaw cards admitting non-members to VFW premises are subject to disciplinary action. National and Department officers cannot defend practices that conflict with VFW Bylaws or procedures.

3. AUDITS:

Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Section 218 (a)(11) of the National Manual of Procedure, Officers: Duties and Obligations. Trustees Report of Audit must be prepared in detail within thirty (30) days from the end of each quarter, June 30 quarter has ended and is **NOW PAST DUE**.

4. BELLS OF PEACE:

On the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918, the sounds of guns were replaced by the sounds of bells ringing through the war-torn fields and communities of Europe. Initiated on November 11, 2018, to honor the WWI Armistice on its 100th anniversary, **Bells of Peace** marks a National U.S. remembrance. Ever since, the Doughboy Foundation has promoted the annual remembrance with tens of thousands having rung the **Bells of Peace** at 11am on Veterans Day, to salute all Americans who served their nation in both conflict and times of peace. The 2024 revised edition reflects the amendments adopted by the 124th National Convention, which becomes effective on August 20, 2023.

13. DIGITAL MEMBERSHIP CARDS:

18. INCORPORATION:

The attention of the Post Commander is directed to section 708 of the National By-Laws and the Manual of Procedure, which prescribes the procedure for the Incorporation of Units. It shall be the responsibility of the Post Commander to ensure full compliance with both sections and to ensure that all state requirements for annual filing, fees, etc., are met in a timely manner.

Posts should take the necessary steps to incorporate under the laws of the state in which the Post is located. Financial responsibility laws, as interpreted by the courts, may cause members of unincorporated Posts to be at risk. Incorporating under the provisions of section 708 of the National By-Laws and the Manual of Procedure and the laws of the state will provide protection for Post members. Posts are urged to contact their Department Adjutant to

obtain the proper forms for incorporating. The Articles of Incorporation must be reviewed by the Commander-in-Chief prior to forwarding them to the proper state authorities.

19. IRS FORM 8822-B:

IRS Form 8822-B, it is now a requirement by the IRS that all Posts submit this form. This form must be submitted anytime the Post Quartermaster changes and/or the Post address changes. This is effective January 1, 2014.

Each first place state winner receives a minimum of \$500 at the National level, and the National first place winner wins \$5000.00. A written essay is submitted by each applicant and addresses an annual patriotic theme. The 2023 theme is "How are you inspired by America?" The contest is open to all students in grades 6-8. More specific information, including rules, forms, and brochures, is available at http: www.vfw.org.

In order to have a successful program this year it is important that participating Posts begin recruiting middle schools, teachers and students as soon as possible. Since middle schools in your area have already let out for the summer vacation, you can either contact them now, electronically through emails and social media, or contact them directly as soon as classes resume.

Dear Post Quartermaster,

With the support of the VFW National Headquarters and the VFW Department leadership, the National Council of Administration passed a resolution at the August 28th Council meeting that makes it mandatory for all Posts and Departments to sign up for Automated Clearing House (ACH) payments from the National Headquarters by December 31, 2016.

What is ACH and what does this mean? ACH is a method for the National Headquarters to electronically submit payments to Posts and Departments. ACH is one of the most secure, fastest and efficient payment methods available today. When an ACH payment is transmitted, the deposit will typically be available in the payee's account the following business day. If you provide an e-mail address, you will also receive an e-mail notification whenever a payment is transmitted to your account from National Headquarters, and that e-mail will explain the purpose of the payment.

After December 31, 2016, the National Headquarters will no longer be issuing paper checks to Posts and Departments. Historically there have been thousands of checks to VFW Posts and Department that have gone uncashed, and by signing up for ACH, that issue will be eliminated.

Attached is the ACH application form that needs to be completed and signed. You are also required to attach a voided check from the appropriate bank account.

Thanks for your assistance in making the VFW more efficient.
