## Commander's Message

Greetings. The Department of Virginia has had a very busy and prominent quarter. To begin with we managed to achieve 100 percent membership earlier this month. That marks the ninth consecutive year that the Department of Virginia has earned All-American status. I would like to thank our Membership Team, our outstanding recruiters, and all of our members – old and new. We are proud to be a growth organization supporting our veterans. The following is a recap of our Department activities this past quarter.

On February 1<sup>st</sup>, we celebrated the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Department of Virginia in Mechanicsville, VA. We had a stirring ceremony and celebration, as Past CIC Hal Roesch presented the Department with a *Centennial Certificate* and read a letter from Commander-In-Chief (CIC) Tim Borland. Also, on display was our re-framed, historic, antique charter that reads *February 1*, 1923. This was the first of seven Centennial Celebrations to be held across the Department this year. Every member who attends one of our Centennials will receive a beautiful limitededition VFW Virginia Centennial Coin and all posts in attendance will receive their Post Centennial Medallion.

We participated in several Yellow Ribbon events in February, in

which we greet veterans who are returning from deployment. The last one was in Williamsburg where we recruited 13 new members to the VFW.

The whole month of February we were very active on Capitol Hill-Richmond working hard on gaming issues and to safeguard the rights of our veterans. While we were there lobbying, we were honored on February 15<sup>th</sup> in the Hall of Delegates as our legislators read a resolution "to honor the members, past and present, on the occasion of our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary."

As part of our continuing effort to provide superior service to veterans we instituted two brand-new VFW Posts. Welcome Post 12217, Holland (instituted on February 25 by yours truly) and Post 12218, Haymarket instituted on March 11<sup>th</sup> by Instituting Officer Ken Wiseman and special guest speaker Hal Roesch. Adding new posts in strategic areas helps the VFW to accomplish our core mission.

On March 3<sup>rd</sup> a Dept. of Virginia Life Member received the Congressional Medal of Honor (CMOH). COL Paris Davis, a Vietnam veteran and Life Member of VFW Post 7916 in Woodbridge, VA, received the CMOH at the White House after nearly 60 years. He was honored at a White House ceremony as the President hung the blue ribbon around his neck.

On March 4<sup>th</sup> we held a Centennial Celebration for our northern comrades at VFW Post 1503, Dale City – the World's Largest VFW Post. We had distinguished visitors including CIC Tim Borland, National SVC Duane Sarmiento, National JVC Al "The Real Deal" Lipphardt, Adjutant General Dan West and Quartermaster General Marc Garduno. We heard inspiring speeches in a packed ballroom and afterwards had a great dinner thanks to our Centennial sponsors.

On March 6th the 76<sup>th</sup> National "Parade of Winners" was held in Crystal City, VA. The VFW proudly presented more than \$171,000 in scholarships and awards as it named the national winners of its 2023 Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen youth scholarship competitions. We were very proud to host this event in our Commonwealth.

On March 8<sup>th</sup> the National Legislative Conference was in town staying in Crystal City as they prepped for our CIC's testimony. The Department of Virginia delegation was there, in a standingroom only packed chamber in the Cannon House Office Building. CIC Tim Borland delivered his message of "Every Veteran Counts" before the 118th Congress in a special joint hearing of the House and Senate Committees on Veterans' Affairs

This past quarter your VFW marched in several parades performing Color Guard duties including: the George Washington Parade (Alexandria); the *Ballyshaners* St. Patrick's Parade (Alexandria) and the Ocean View St. Patrick's Day Parade

## VFW Post 2216 awarded Proclamation by City Mayor



At their December 2022 meeting, VFW Post 2216 was awarded a Proclamation by then Mayor Andrea Oakes for their contributions both locally and nationally, totaling almost \$450,000 from 2014 to 2021. In 2022 alone, a total of \$58,875 in monetary contributions were made locally and nationally. A partial list of charities or non-profits they contribute to are: VFW Unmet Needs Program, VFW Widows and Children's Home, Habitat for Humanity, Wounded Warrior Project, Project Healing Waters, Salvation

Army, local Food Banks, American Red Cross and many more. Since its charter in 1931, VFW Post 2216 has made a priority of staying in touch with its community and Veterans and families, while also providing an Honor Guard for graveside burial services. VFW Post 2216 holds various community events throughout the year, such as their Veterans Day open house, which provides food and refreshments as well as a 50/50 drawing, raffles and door prizes, all free to veterans and their families, as well as the public.

## 'Fighting Fourth' Posts on Way to All-American

The 'Fighting Fourth' District Va. VFW held its annual academic award recognitions during its most recent meeting February, 11 at the Amelia VFW. District Coordinator Fred Hill said teachers "are there all the time serving our children. Our teachers are our unsung heroes."

All honorees in attendance were effusive.

Camela (Cam) Williams, first place Middle School Teacher of the Year remarked that she felt "humbled and honored to be recognized by a group of people I think so highly of." Williams has for several years actively promoted the Patriot's Pen and Voice of Democracy programs at Kenston Forest School in Blackstone and has forwarded over 450 to 500 entries over the years.

Also recognized was Joe Baldwin of Farmville, the only remaining World War II veteran on the District Committee, who received a standing ovation from his VFW comrades. Baldwin is retired Navy and was in Tokyo Bay when the Japanese signed the "instruments of surrender" before Douglas MacArthur and other senior allied military personnel.

#### Membership

Recruiting Chair Tommy Hines reported the district had 35 new members, four reinstated and 13 new Life members. It was reported the district was only 31 members short of 100% and could very well make District All-American if the numbers come in and donation requirement is met. The district approved a \$100 donation to the National Veterans and Military Support (VMS) fund to meet that need.

#### **State and National Contests**

It was reported that, except for meeting membership, Farmville Post 7059 and South Hill Post 7166 had already met requirements for All-State. Additionally, two Posts, Amelia 8759 and Charlotte County/Drakes Branch Post 8902 have met all the requirements for All-American. Four other Posts, Farmville 7059, South Hill 7166, Crewe 7819 and Clarksville 8163 are in striking distance of meeting membership requirements for All-American and should achieve those goals before the State Convention in June. If all six posts make All-American, that would be 50% of the district.

#### **Inspector Present**

VFW State Inspector Charles Bush was present and said the 4th District report "was the cleanest I've ever seen" in commitments met. He said, "it was the best report I've ever seen from a district," He told District Officers and attendees to "take care of veterans, take care of your community, and take care of our law enforcement. Let's keep doing what we do and thank you for what you do."

He also commended and recognized the following District 4 Posts for being 'inspection ready': Post 7059, 7166, 8166, 8466, 8902, 9954 and 12200. He noted all Posts met reporting requirements for the first and second half of the year and four Posts (7897 Blackstone, 8759 Amelia, 9855 Appomattox and 12200 Emporia) had already exceeded 100%. He also awarded pins for the 'one member' recruiting push.
