

Eagle Scout Honored

On the evening of Tuesday, September 10th 2019 at the rural Central Baptist Church in Church Road Virginia, James Paul Sarafolean III, known as "JJ" was recognized as the newest Eagle Scout in Boy Scouts of America Troop 185. Previously, the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 12145 in Dinwiddie County had repurposed an old mailbox to give county residents a place to put their US flags that were no longer serviceable and placed it at the Eastside Enhancement Center in Dinwiddie

County. JJ took his Scout Oath to heart and identified that having only one flag depository receptacle in a county as large as Dinwiddie County was not enough. He decided that his Eagle project would be to design, build, paint, and deliver three additional U.S. Flag depositories for flags that were ready for retirement. JJ successfully accomplished his project with the help and support of his family, friends, and his troop. His flag retirement depositories are located at the following locations: Ford Volunteer Fire Department in Church Road, at the Ragsdale Community Center in McKenney, and Carson Fire Department in Carson. JJ's Eagle project will serve the Dinwiddie County and surrounding communities for many years to come. VFW Post 12145, Post Commander Dave Dudley and Senior Vice Commander Jerry Horne presented JJ with a certificate for his achievement in reaching the highest advancement rank in Boy Scouting (see additional photos at back of newsletter).

In the 2018-2019 VFW year, the foundation supported numerous VFW programs including a \$10,000 grant to fund two-thirds of the emergency financial assistance given to members of the U.S. Coast Guard by the Virginia VFW when they did not get paid during a partial government shutdown.

VFW Post 7059 conducted its annual POW/MIA Remembrance on the lawn of the Prince Edward County Courthouse on Sept. 20. POW/MIA Recognition Day is a day of remembrance and hope for the safe and speedy return of American Prisoners of Wars and those still Missing in Action. It also seeks the return of the remains of Fallen Soldiers. Today, there are still more than 83,000 American troops missing in action, according to the Department of Defense Prisoner of War-Missing Personnel Office. That includes some 73,681 from World War II; 7,947 from the Korean War; 126 during the Cold War; 1,657 from the Vietnam War; and six from Iraq and other conflicts.

'You are not forgotten'

The Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Virginia recognized those Virginians who remain unaccounted for in all wars by dedicating a new monument at Albert G. Horton Jr. Memorial

Veterans Cemetery on Friday.

This ceremony was held on Friday for National POW/ **MIA Recognition** Day, which is observed on the third Friday in September to honor those who were prisoners of war and those who are still missing in



unaccounted for from U.S. wars going back to the beginning of World War II, according to James Evans, commander of VFW Department of Virginia District 2.

reads "this unoccupied seat is dedicated to the memory of the brave men and women of Virginia who are unaccounted for, from all wars," followed by an earnest and everlasting proclamation: "you are not forgotten."

"The purpose of this monument is to give us focus," VFW National Surgeon General Dr. Curtis "Doc" Bohlman said in his remarks. "To focus our thoughts on our comrades who have given so much, and remind us to say 'you are not forgotten' to our prisoners of war, those still missing in action and their families, many of whom still seek closure."

The Chair of Honor was made possible by contributions from VFW Department of Virginia District 2, VFW Post Auxiliaries and the VFW Riders Virginia, according to Michael Chism, POW/MIA committee chair for the Department of Virginia.

"Congratulations are in order to all who contributed and worked so hard that this monument might be constructed," Bohlman said.

VFW Department of Virginia District 2 Posts were represented at the ceremony, which was also attended by Suffolk City Council members, as well as friends and family.

The posting of VFW and branches of service flags was done in absolute silence that was punctuated only by careful footsteps, commands for direction and chirps of birds in trees throughout. family of these missing military men and women.

"It is true that the costs of war extend far beyond the last shots being fired, but for missing in action families, the passage of time does not heal their wounds," he said. "For them the days become weeks, the weeks become months, then years, and now sadly decades. "I cannot imagine the loss I would feel if my mother or father went off to war and didn't return," he continued. "I cannot imagine reliving the moment the government couldn't tell me if my brother or sister is alive or dead. I cannot imagine any emotions if that missing person was my son or daughter."

"I'm really happy to see this turnout," VFW Virginia State Com-

mander Rick Raskin said in his remarks. "It speaks well for the community in the Suffolk area, and for the dedication that you

have toward our veterans and our missing in action."

The Nansemond River High School Air Force JROTC cadets performed the Missing Man Table ceremony for the proceedings. Each facet of this table's symbolism was read aloud, and each reading was marked by a sharp ring of the bell.

"One thing I know for sure is that it means a lot to us today," State Commander Raskin said about the Missing Man Table, "but it may not mean so much in the future, because as time goes on people tend to forget. But that memorial that we're dedicating out there today will be there a lot longer than any of these tables will remain, and it will always keep us remembering what we need to remember — that we don't forget our MIA and POWs.



State officers visit District 12 November 8-10, 2019

State Commander Rick Raskin conducted a roundup in Virginia District 12, the furthest Southwest District in the state, from November 8-10, 2019. Accompanying him were State Judge Advocate Eddie Reasor, State Surgeon Geoff Lyster, State Inspector Gary Adams, District 12 Commander Bud Davis and District 12 Historian Ken Hayes.

We visited Posts in Abingdon (1994), Damascus (9830), Bristol (6975), Coeburn (8652), Pound (9600), Clintwood (8975), Lebanon (9864) and Grundy (7360). Several Posts said they had never had a state officer visit, so our visit was a first.

The focus of the visits was to offer any assistance the Department could to help Posts with their programs and membership. We discussed the \$50 VFW Store gift certificate for those who renew, upgrade or sign up as life members. At each Post we talked about youth awards and encouraged continued participation. We also encouraged them to continue involvement in their communities.

Several notable things occurred:

- At Bristol I was privileged to pin medals on Robert Altizer, a Korean War veteran who had never received them. There were about one hundred people present for an event that was to occur later and they all gave a resounding applause.
- Bristol's Post home is located on the Tennessee side of State Street, and as such is subject to the gaming laws of that state. This severely limits the opportunity for a revenue stream. They have been trying to relocate to Virginia and recently acquired a suitable storefront with assistance from Powerhouse Gaming. Post members have been active in renovating the property and should have moved in by the time this is published.
- At Coeburn I presented the All-American Award to Post Commander Luther Willis. They were also celebrating the Post's 70th anniversary and had a veterans breakfast which was well attended by members from several Posts.
- I dispelled a rumor that we were about to close a Post because they had less than \$6000 in their account. It is interesting how rumors can start, and I was glad the Department was there to put the matter to rest.
- The Commander at Lebanon is also a County Councilman and I had an interesting conversation with him on how well the VFW is perceived in their community.
- One of the members at Grundy commented that he would like to see our color guards hone their presentation skills. I took the matter as an action item and will pursue adding a module to our Schools of Instruction. Virginia conducts SOIs in each District in order to reach a wider audience.
- District 12 Commander Davis had challenged each Post to recruit at least one new member before our visit and two Posts met the challenge.

It is encouraging to see that many of these small Posts are making do with what they have. They are doing an excellent job of keeping their Posts going. Despite the small number of members many have, they are active in VFW programs and enjoy the unique camaraderie that we VFW members all share.

I hope that our visit reinvigorated many members who felt that they were being ignored by the Department. Many times, I heard the comment that "the VFW stops at Roanoke". I feel our visit helped to alleviate that perception.



Charitable Gaming to be a Major Issue at the Legislature

Once again, the issue that impacts the business side of our organization will again be a hot topic in the Virginia legislature. Charitable Gaming will be considered in many ways and as part of a larger issue on the future of gambling in the Commonwealth. Your VFW, along with other charities, manufacturers of charitable gaming units, and distributors of the equipment will again come together under the banner of the Virginia Charitable Gaming Council (VCGC) to fight for our ability to modernize and expand gaming for charities.

Electronic and paper pull-tabs, bingo, and other paper products are key to raising money for what we give to and for the success of our canteens. Even the IRS considers gaming in our canteens to be a central part of the culture of the groups, like the VFW, who are 501c19 non-profits. However, we need to modernize gaming and fight the entities who run illegal operations which take away our business and threaten the good name of charitable gaming. Regulated by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, charitable gaming is proven, regulated, and managed making it aa major thing for charities to be concerned about.

The VCGC adopted five priorities recently to help us navigate the new session of the state legislature, which starts in January. First, we want to modernize charitable gaming by removing arbitrary limits on how often gaming can be done (currently two days for bingo), how audit fees are calculated, and how Use of Proceeds (the portion of profits that must be spent on approved expenses and charity actions) can also cover more expenses related to the games. Second, we want to be able to expand our ability to place electronic gaming machines associated with charities to include ABC approved locations which allows us to compete with "gray area" gaming that may be illegal (cases are pending). Third, oppose all illegal forms of gaming with tougher laws. Fourth, allow charities to hold Texas Hold'em poker tournaments. Finally, we also support expanding the number of electronic pull-tab machines beyond the current number of nine that can be in our canteens.

We will see a major push ahead of us for these goals. I ask that you consider coming to the state capitol on January 15th to support this effort during our "Day on the Hill" for charitable gaming. With the casinos coming, we need to fight for our future.



VA Ordered to Pay ER Bills for Vets

The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States is applauding the U.S. Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims, who in a 2-1 decision Monday, correctly ruled for the plaintiffs in Wolfe v. Wilkie. The class action lawsuit was the result of the Department of Veterans Affairs failing to fully reimburse veterans for the emergency room care they received from non-VA facilities, an issue the VFW had thought solved in 2016 when the same court ruled in favor of Staab v. Shulkin. But a report released last month by the VA Office of Inspector General found that the non-VA emergency room claims of some 17,400 veterans were denied or rejected primarily due to a VA work culture that favored speed over accuracy, a number that accounts for nearly a third of the 60,800 claims examined during the IG's six-month nationwide audit in 2017.

"The first thing the VA tells people to do when calling is to hang up and dial 911 if it's an emergency," said VFW National Commander William J. "Doc" Schmitz. "So the VA must reimburse the actual cost of emergency medical care, regardless of whether the veteran has secondary insurance or not," he said. 



VA Sending Letters to those Denied Bluewater Navy Benefits

With the passage of the Bluewater Navy Vietnam Veterans Act, as many as 90,000 veterans previously denied and thousands more who have become sick from Agent Orange exposure will finally get their benefits. As soon as the President signed the bill, VA halted any processing of those claims until January 1st, 2020. The VFW opposed that halting but the time is soon to end and those impacted veterans should file their claims.

14 conditions are currently connected to Agent Orange as listed in federal law. Those conditions are known as the "presumptive list" of conditions. Veterans will still need to submit evidence and medical records, but these claims will be much easier to win because of the new law and the presumptive list.

Veterans previously denied for Bluewater Navy benefits will be getting a letter from the VA encouraging them to file again. This is a real letter and it should be taken seriously. That letter is also evidence as the law included a provision that those veterans previously denied will get retroactive payments to the date of their previous denial.

The change of the law also added other benefits. Those veterans exposed to Agent Orange on the Korean DMZ will have an earlier start date for the period that is known to have seen service members exposed to the dangerous chemical. Also, children of those veterans stationed in Thailand will now be included for Spina Bifida coverage. The birth defect, which is the only one a father can pass to their child and one of several a mother can pass because of Agent Orange exposure, includes all types of the condition except Spina Bifida Occulta.

The fight continues for those veterans who were stationed in Thailand. Also, the VFW remains committed to adding more conditions to the presumptive list as science indicates.

Those veterans seeking to file for VA benefits should ask for help from a VFW Service Officer. The VFW has offices in Hopewell, Staunton, Dale City, and Norfolk.




